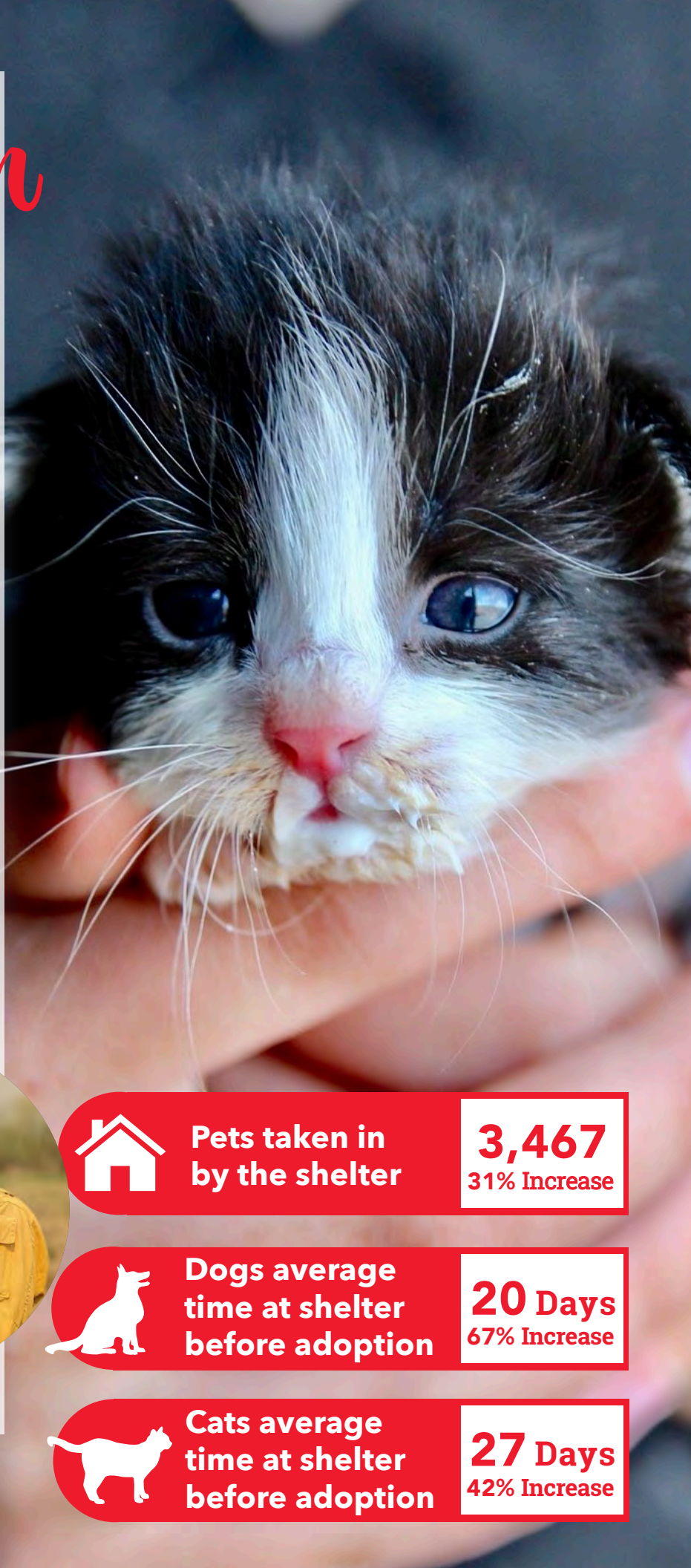

Heroism and Heart

This year record-setting wildfires ravaged New Mexico. Española Humane received 65 animals, including cats from our sister shelter in Las Vegas, dogs left homeless by the fire, and seven puppies evacuated by hot shots from the smoldering ash. When we learned that firefighters were feeding their lunches to displaced pets, we organized pet food deliveries to the fire camp. These heroes not only put their lives at risk fighting the blaze, but also compassionately cared for hungry, scared, lonely pets.

Not Letting Go

Elsa was found covered in snow and frozen in our overnight drop area, just steps from a heated, secure box for kitties. She had no heartbeat, and her temperature was so cold it didn't register on a thermometer. Our staff refused to give up on her, and against all odds - including a broken pelvis and pneumonia - Elsa survived. Now this resilient, forgiving little being is adopted and growing up with the joy of family and sunshine-warmed beds.

Four Legged Fliers

Nine puppies and their mom are now living the high life in the Hamptons, thanks to our transfer team and the volunteer pilots of the Four Legged Fliers. After a 1,700-mile flight across the country, the dogs were all adopted through the Animal Rescue Fund of the Hamptons. The pups and their mom took a little bit of their home state to New York with New Mexico-themed names: Blue Corn, Biscochito, Ristra, Yucca, Piñon, Osha, Sopapilla, Frijoles, Chamisa, and mama Zia.



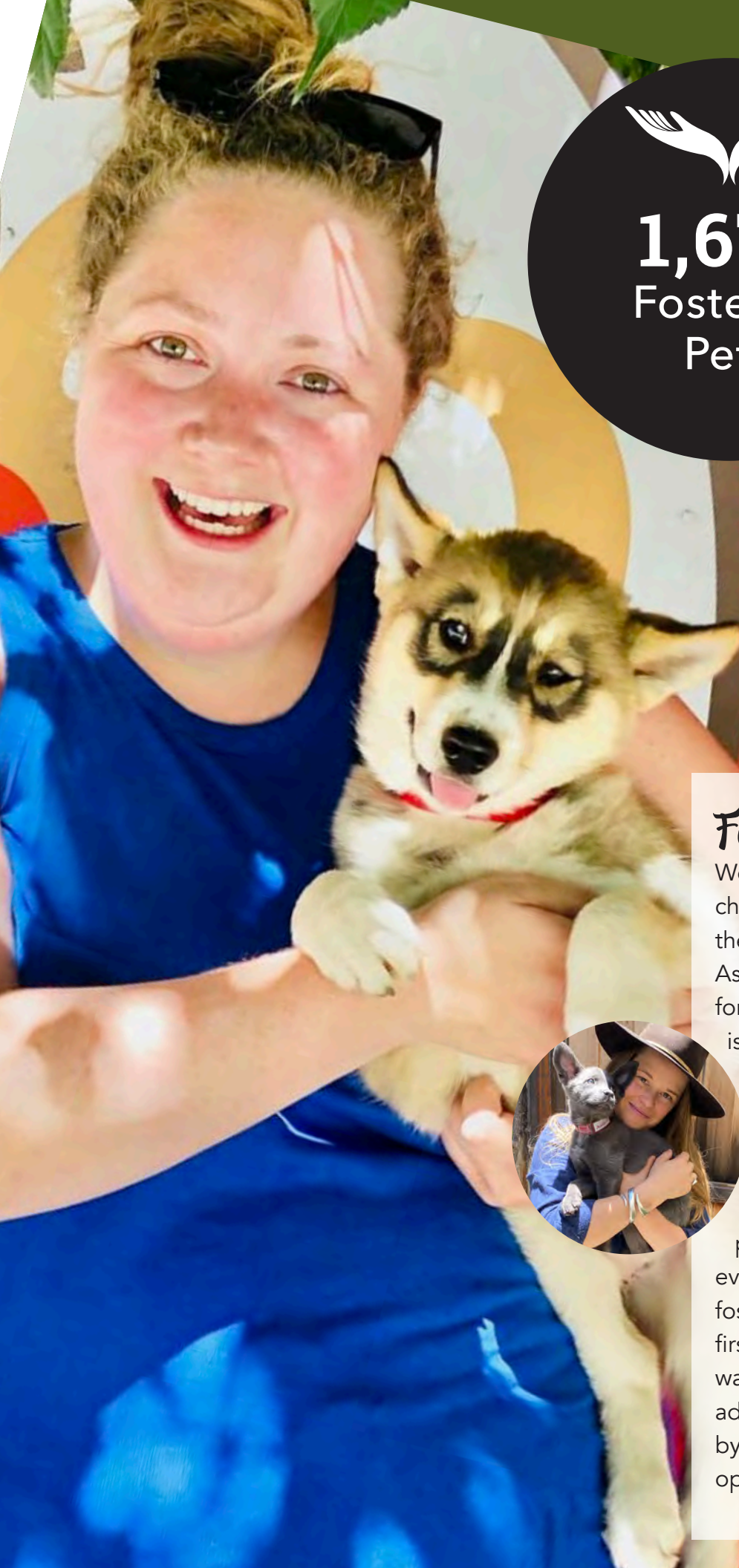

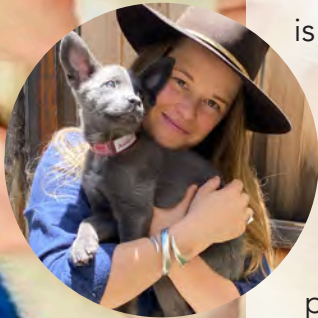

6,166 Microchips

20,795 Vaccines & Tests

We gave 318 free vaccines at our drive-through vaccine clinic, and cars were lined up for as far as the eye could see! Distemper and Parvo cases were on the rise, driven by pandemic closures, which left families unable to keep their pets' vaccines up to date. Additionally, with the fire evacuations, people and pets were forced into tight living quarters, where sickness can spread more quickly. We did our part to stem the tide of vaccine-preventable diseases in dogs and cats by offering our communities bi-weekly free and low-cost vaccine clinics.

Next Generation of Animal Lovers

Fifty elementary students visited our shelter with donations and smiling excitement to meet our animals. Students got their own clipboards to do an "intake exam" on a puppy, learned how to use our ultrasound machine, crafted pumpkin-iced dog biscuits with sprinkles, stuffed Kong toys with cheese and pretzels, colored cat adoption boxes and houses, and even named a few kitties as they drew pictures of them!





Paws in the Pen

Paws in the Pen is a mentorship-based dog training program pairing inmate trainers with our shelter underdogs who need a little extra help to find forever homes. Cody was the first graduate of this 24/7 training program. This shepherd mix had been overlooked for weeks, essentially growing up in the shelter, and he needed to learn basic manners to help him find a forever family. After







weeks of training, Cody walked out of the penitentiary to hugs and cheers, like a celebrity, with pages of handwritten training notes for his adopters, a shirt made in a class, and even a new Christmas collar, specially purchased for his adopters because the trainer and staff knew he would be home for the holidays. We are so proud of this partnership, with reciprocal benefits to both our dogs and the inmates.
